Structure of the Examination:

The GCSE English Language exam consists of two examinations that will be taken at the end of Year 11. In addition, each exam is worth 50% of their overall GCSE grade.

Paper 1: Explorations in creative reading and writing (1 hour 45 minutes – 80 marks)

Paper 2: Writers' viewpoints and perspectives (1 hour 45 minutes – 80 marks)

Assessment Methods:

A linear exam at the end of Year 11.

Spoken Language Assessment: This is a non-examination assessed piece and it forms part of each student's overall GCSE grade. Each student is required to complete a formal presentation to an audience on a specific topic using Standard English and they will respond to a range of questions from the audience. Furthermore, the Spoken Language unit is assessed by the teacher and it is graded Pass, Merit or Distinction.

English Literature

Structure of the Examination

The GCSE English Literature exam consists of two exams; the first paper is worth 40% and the second paper is worth 60%.

Paper 1: Shakespeare and the 19th century novel (1 hour 45 minutes – 64 marks)

Paper 2: Modern Texts and Poetry (2 hours 15 minutes – 96 marks)

Assessment Methods:

A linear exam at the end of Year 11.
